- Adopts many of the recommendations from three reports regarding the interconnection of distributed energy resources under Electric Tariff Rule 21 of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Southern California Edison Company (Utilities): Working Group Two Report, Working Group Three Report, and Vehicle-to-Grid Alternating Current Subgroup.
- Most of the adopted recommendations involve revisions to Rule 21 and address many objectives of this proceeding, including streamlining, transparency, and alignment with the Integration Capacity Analysis developed in the Distributed Resources Planning proceeding.
- Requires Utilities to implement these changes as described in the Ordering Paragraphs of this decision.
